# **ABOUT VIBE**

VIBE Arts is a unique, award-winning charity that cultivates youth creativity through arts education. VIBE is proud to direct its work toward underrepresented communities and spaces of Toronto and beyond, engaging with individuals age 3-29 who might identify as disempowered. Our two-pronged holistic approach to arts education programming has evolved over the course of 20 years. Since being founded by Lola Rasminsky in 1995, VIBE Arts has provided arts education opportunities at no cost to young people. Our work lives in accessible spaces including schools, community centres, public housing, hospitals, libraries, parks, detention centres, shelters and shopping malls.

## EDUCATION

VIBE encourages growth, creativity, wellness and resilience in children and youth living in priority neighbourhoods across the GTA.

Through our work, we address the imbalance of arts funding across Ontario. Some communities where our programs take place are Jamestown, Jane and Finch, Weston-Mt. Dennis, Kingston-Galloway, Lawrence Heights, Regent Park, Toronto Central, Warden Woods, Malvern, and Victoria Village.

VIBE programs are designed to meet local needs and respond to the uniqueness of each community. We provide a vareity of diverse artistic disciplines to suit the particular interests and cultures of each neighbourhood.

## MENTORSHIP

VIBE ensures that youth from under-served communities can access opportunities to transition into the professional arts world through experiences, strong partnerships and field placements.

We provide young, under-employed and under-resourced artists with leadership and mentorship opportunities. Our roster of Emerging Arts Educators is made up of youth between the ages of 18 and 28 who live, work, and spend time in the communities that VIBE Arts serves.

Through VIBE programming, artists receive meaningful employment opportunities to learn alongside professional arts educators and eventually lead their own programs across a vareity of disciplines.


# VIBE BY THE NUMBERS

# Programming highlight: Kaleidoscope Mural

In July 2018, VIBE Arts teamed up with StreetARToronto (StART) and began the process of transforming a huge stretch of brick wall into a piece of art. The finished mural, located at Centennial East Recreation Centre at 1967 Ellesmere Road in Scarborough, features multiple species of butterflies and has been named 'Kaleidoscope', after the word meaning 'a collective of butterflies'.
