VISION


Vibrant communities where young people express themselves artistically and use their creativity and leadership to engage fully in community.



Program Highlights

In our 2022-2023 programming year, **46 artists received creative mentorship and exhibition opportunities** through our mentorship programs-**NExT**, **Desire Lines and LaunchPAD**, **NExT Level and Converge**.

This year we were excited to present our artists with two new mentorship programs, **NExT Level and Converge**, which **offered unique opportunities for artists to collaborate and continue building their skills towards sustainable careers in the arts.**

Converge showcased the collaborative artwork of 16 youth artists on the VIBE Arts roster from different cultural backgrounds. These artists have been paired up to create 8 unique works of art that represent both artists' cultural backgrounds in an attempt to put on display the similarities and differences between the roots of those living in Canada.

As a continuation of our NExT Mentorship program, ScotiaRISE **NExT Level is a two**year long mentorship program focused on professionalizing BIPOC artists who are interested in pursuing a career in the arts. 10 artists receive one-on-one support from mentors and professional development opportunities, design and deliver an arts program in their community as well as create work for a final exhibition.

This year we said goodbye (for now!) to two 3-year projects **supporting two distinct regions**: Toronto's Weston-Mount Dennis neighbourhood and Sioux Lookout, Thunder Bay and Sault Ste Marie in Northern Ontario.

Between these two projects, **this year** alone we provided **53 workshops to 1,824 participants**. Our 3 year impact reached over 4,100 participants through 115 multi-disciplinary and culturally relevant workshops. We continue to provide free, highquality arts programs in these communities through our other community arts offerings.



Since 2020, VIBE has had the privilege of collaborating with artists, community partners including schools, community centres, Boys and Girls Clubs and hospitals through **SPARK**, a series of free arts programs geared towards youth aged 7-13 **in Toronto's Weston-Mount Dennis Neighbourhood**.

More than 3000 young people were able to take part in 75 free multi-week SPARK programs exploring a wide range of artistic mediums including: Beat Making, Bollywood Dance, Comic Arts, Digital Illustration, Hip Hop Dance, Mixed Media, Photography, Printmaking, Painting and Spoken Word.

In our 2022-2023 programming year, we provided 36 multi-week SPARK programs to the community!

Through **Boreal Creates**, VIBE has collaborated with Indigenous artists and arts assistants in Northern Ontario to deliver community-driven, free arts education programming.

Since the start of the project, **1,152** community members took part in 40+ free multi-week Boreal Creates programs exploring a wide range of artistic mediums including: Beading, Medicine Bag Making, Woodland Arts, Printmaking, Drawing, Lacrosse Stick Making, Filmmaking, Wood Carving, Painting and Mitten Making.

In our 2022-2023 programming year, we provided 14 multi-week Boreal Creates programs to communities in Sault Ste. Marie, Sioux Lookout and Thunder Bay!

Artist Spotlight Kseniya Tsoy



VIBE: Tell us about yourself!

KT: My name is Kseniya Tsoy. I'm a visual artist originally from Uzbekistan and now based out of Toronto. I specialize in community engaged art projects with social purpose. I love working with community members of different ages, but especially I love working with children and youth.

VIBE: When did you start your journey with VIBE?

KT: I joined VIBE in 2022, which was unbelievably just last year. I had moved to Toronto from Ottawa and I was looking to engage in the local arts scene. So many people referred me to VIBE. When I would say that I love working with community members, and I love doing community art projects so many people would be saying, "have you ever heard about VIBE Arts?". So I joined the roster just last year and very soon after VIBE offered me a lead role for project in Scarborough as part of the

City of Toronto's Cultural Hotspot proaram.

For me as someone who had just moved to Toronto, and felt pretty new to Canada, I really appreciated that opportunity. In fact, it was my first big mural as a lead artist in Toronto, in a neighbourhood where I actually lived, so it was extremely meaningful to me.

That kick-started my career in this new city and I really, really appreciated it.

VIBE: In what wavs has VIBE supported your artistic and career growth?

KT: The Cultural Hotspot program was my first project that I did with VIBE. Being on the roster is wonderful and I can recommend it to anyone, any artist. Because VIBE would reach out to you with an offering to participate in some other projects.

Another memorable project is a mosaic sunflower project I did together with my peers, which was led by very experienced mosaic artist Cristina Delago.

I think it was one of those important and interesting projects because I was pushed out of my comfort zone. I am a visual artist and it is usual for me to paint murals, to create visual works of art. And while mosaic is also a visual art form, it was something that I had never done before.

So learning from the best was very important, but also I did appreciate that soon after I was given an opportunity to lead a group of youth to create their own mosaics after being trained in this medium. So that was a very interesting project. Plus, I got to work with my peers, Tara Dorey, Frannie Potts and Serene Chan.

That whole idea of community and making things together in collaboration is very dear to me.

Perhaps one of my favorite parts about being on the VIBE Arts roster is that it's like a family. The office is like home and I connect greatly with the folks who work at VIBE, and also folks who are on the roster of other artists.

It is here, especially as a newcomer, that I met new friends, made artistic connections, and we even took it beyond and worked on other projects.

So I think that is something that I always would love to recommend, for artists to join the VIBE Arts roster.

VIBE: What do you think makes VIBE unique as a community arts organization?

I think what makes VIBE Arts unique is that for one, it's already in the name. VIBE Arts for Children and Youth. I think the fact that an organization has a mandate to work with children and youth is already special. You know that if you do want to work with the younger generation where to go in Toronto. So this is one of the things that I appreciate, because again, I really love working with children.

Another thing that I really appreciate about VIBE Arts is that mentorship is weaved into the organization's mandate.

So whenever I meet an emerging artist who is starting their journey in the arts field, in the arts scene in Toronto, I always recommend that they join VIBE because I know that it is an organization that provides opportunities to hone your artistic skills, to make friends and collaborate with other artists, and showcase your work.

Having a sense of community makes VIBE speciál because we as independent artists can'sometimes be so lonely. You do art by yourself. You generally spend time on your own so much that it's amazing to feel like you can come somewhere and have peers and your circle, your community. So l'm grateful for that.

VIBE always has exciting projects. What I like about the programs that come through VIBE is that it's always exciting partnerships with other organizations and community spaces that I have never worked with.

I do believe that the young generation is the future.


